MUMBAI: Saturday, September 5 saw the launch of India's first NDLM (National Digital Literacy Mission) centre dedicated to training disabled persons in digital literacy in Mumbai.

The Helen Keller Institute for Deaf & Deafblind (HKIDB) and NASSCOM Foundation jointly announced the venture. HKIDB will provide training and make the internet accessible to disabled people. Computers have been loaded with hardware and software like Job Access with Speech (JAWS) software, speakers, microphones, braille keyboards and braille printers.

Beneficiaries will be trained on computers and mobile phones. They can send emails, connect on social media, shop on e-commerce websites and register for an Aadhaar card, ration card and PAN card.

NDLM is a platform of digital literacy awareness and education programmes that can help rural communities join the mainstream. NASSCOM Foundation is industry partner to the Government of India to accomplish the first phase by making 52.5 lakh individuals in India digitally literate in the next four years.
